Wichita is the eighth-best city for first time homebuyers. One good sign for first-time homebuyers in this city is that it has one of the highest loan funding rates. Over 82% of conventional mortgage applications here are funded. For that metric, Wichita ranks second.

Did You Know?

- **Purchasing a home in Wichita is 31% cheaper than the national median price** — The median selling price of existing (previously owned) single-family homes in the Wichita metro area was \$156,800 in the Fourth Quarter 2019 survey by the National Association of Realtors. Wichita ranked 35th of 179 reporting metro areas; and \$118,100, or 43 percent, below the national median price of \$274,900. (ACCRA Cost-of-Living Survey)
- **Newly built home prices in Wichita are 34.7% below national average** — The average sale price of newly built single-family homes in the Wichita metro area was \$289,843. That is \$154,153, or 34.7 percent, below the corresponding national figure of \$443,996 (C2ER COLI 2022-Q1)
- **Apartment rent is nearly 34% lower in Wichita than the national average** — Average two-bedroom apartment monthly rent was \$889 in the first quarter of 2022. That is \$442, or 33.2 percent, lower than the national figure of \$1,331. (C2ER COLI, 2022-Q1)



● **Wichita ranked most affordable city in the nation for renters** — With rental costs increasing by 89 percent in the nation’s top 250 cities, Wichita is the most affordable city in the nation for renters with an average rent of \$746 per month. ([RentCafe](#))
