

PARTNERSHIP HELPS CELEBRATE NIAR'S 40 YEARS AND HAMR RIBBON-CUTTING

Wichita, KAN., Dec. 15, 2025 – Today, national, state and regional leaders gathered in Wichita to celebrate the 40th anniversary of Wichita State University's National Institute for Aviation Research (NIAR) and the ribbon-cutting of the new Hub for Advanced Manufacturing Research (HAMR).

The Greater Wichita Partnership (Partnership) played a key role in bringing together federal officials, industry representatives and regional partners to recognize NIAR's global impact on innovation, advanced manufacturing and workforce development.

U.S. Senator Jerry Moran invited U.S. Secretary of Transportation Sean Duffy to Wichita for the celebration, underscoring NIAR's significance to the aviation, defense and manufacturing sectors.

"His dedication has brought some of the nation's most influential companies to Wichita and helped grow new business for our local suppliers. The ribbon-cutting for HAMR, the world's largest additive manufacturing research center, marked a significant expansion of NIAR's capabilities in automation, materials research, defense modernization and applied innovation. The facility will help industry partners solve complex manufacturing challenges and accelerate technological advancement across aviation, defense and emerging industries.
