Work of the talent, workforce development and community engagement team continues to follow the direction of the Talent Roadmap, with four strategies and 13 priorities identified to ensure we are a vibrant, global community of possibility that invests boldly, takes risks, and defies expectations.

Love, Kansas

The Kansas Department of Commerce's "Love, Kansas" initiative is designed to enhance state pride and community engagement by celebrating local businesses, cultural heritage and the diverse experiences that define Kansas. The Partnership hosted a Wichita launch for this initiative in partnership with the Wichita State Foundation and Alumni Engagement, where over 100 attendees pledged to encourage others to return to Kansas. We Love, Kansas and Choose Wichita.

Talent Talks

Hosted four Talent Talk events in response to the three workshops hosted in 2023.

- ► Hosted a total of 380+ attendees.
- Engaged with 97 regional bussinesses from 13 industries.

Discussions focused on critical workforce and educational needs, pipeline development, internships and apprenticeship opportunities and the evolving landscape of tech in the workforce.



Grants & Activities

HCA Healthcare Pipeline Grant

Hosted 220 local 7th and 8th graders, from 6 different schools, for a hands-on introduction to careers at the USD 259 Future Ready Center for Healthcare. Created mobile healthcare kits to reach 3,000 more middle school students throughout the 2024-2025 school year.

Talent Community Engagement Committee (TCEC)

In its first year, TCEC addressed parking, revised the Arts Plan, explored learning models, and engaged with Mayor Lily Wu, boosting community outreach.

Talent Roadmap Leadership Coalition (TRLC)

TRLC reviewed Talent Roadmap progress, noting slight improvements in most areas. This evaluation reflects year-over-year progress on how the Greater Wichita Partnership is advancing perception across four key categories. Project Downtown 2035: The Downtown Wichita Action Plan will create the roadmap for growth in our core over the next decade. 
